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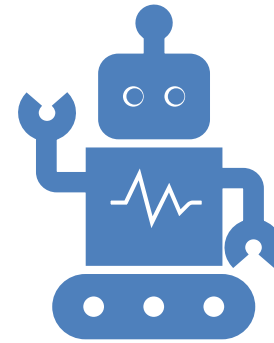

Fostering Data Sharing and Interoperability

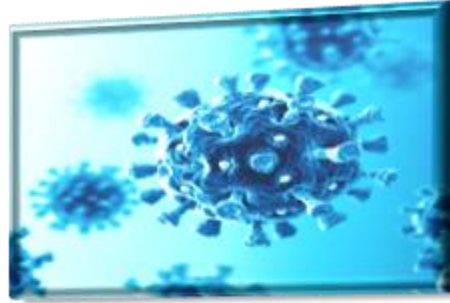


PPPs support standardized protocols and secure data-sharing practices, which enhance coordinated patient care and population health management.
